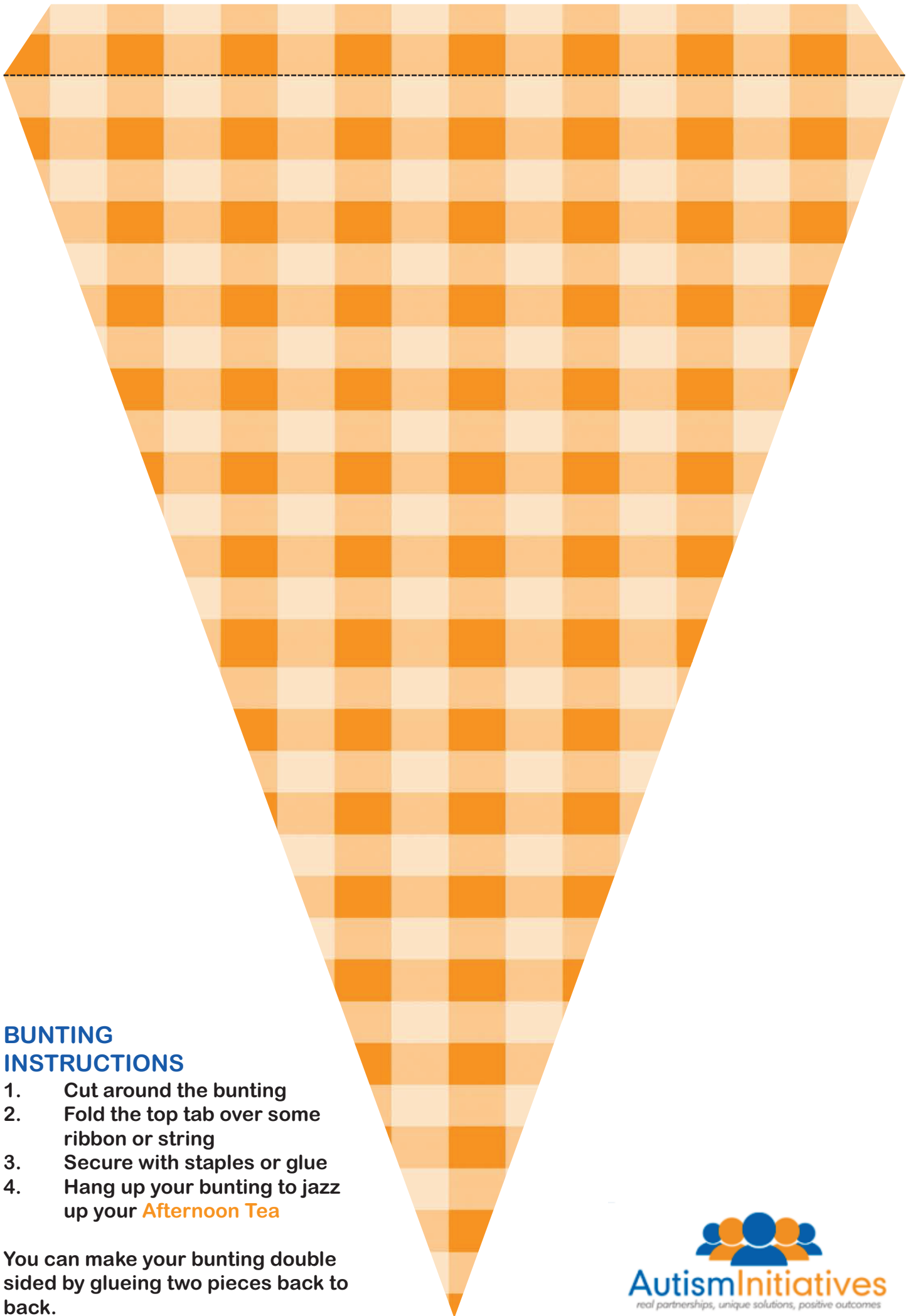

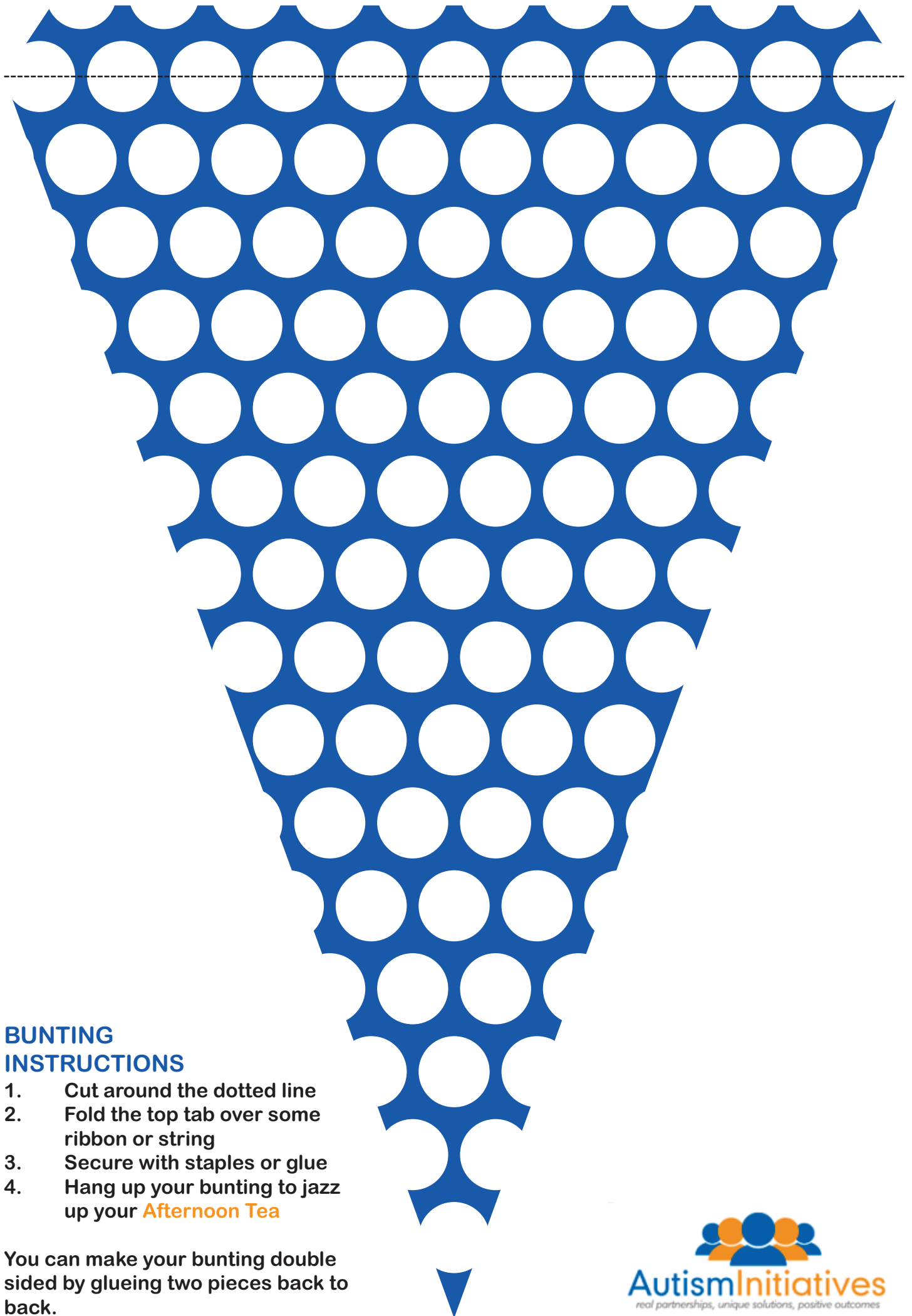

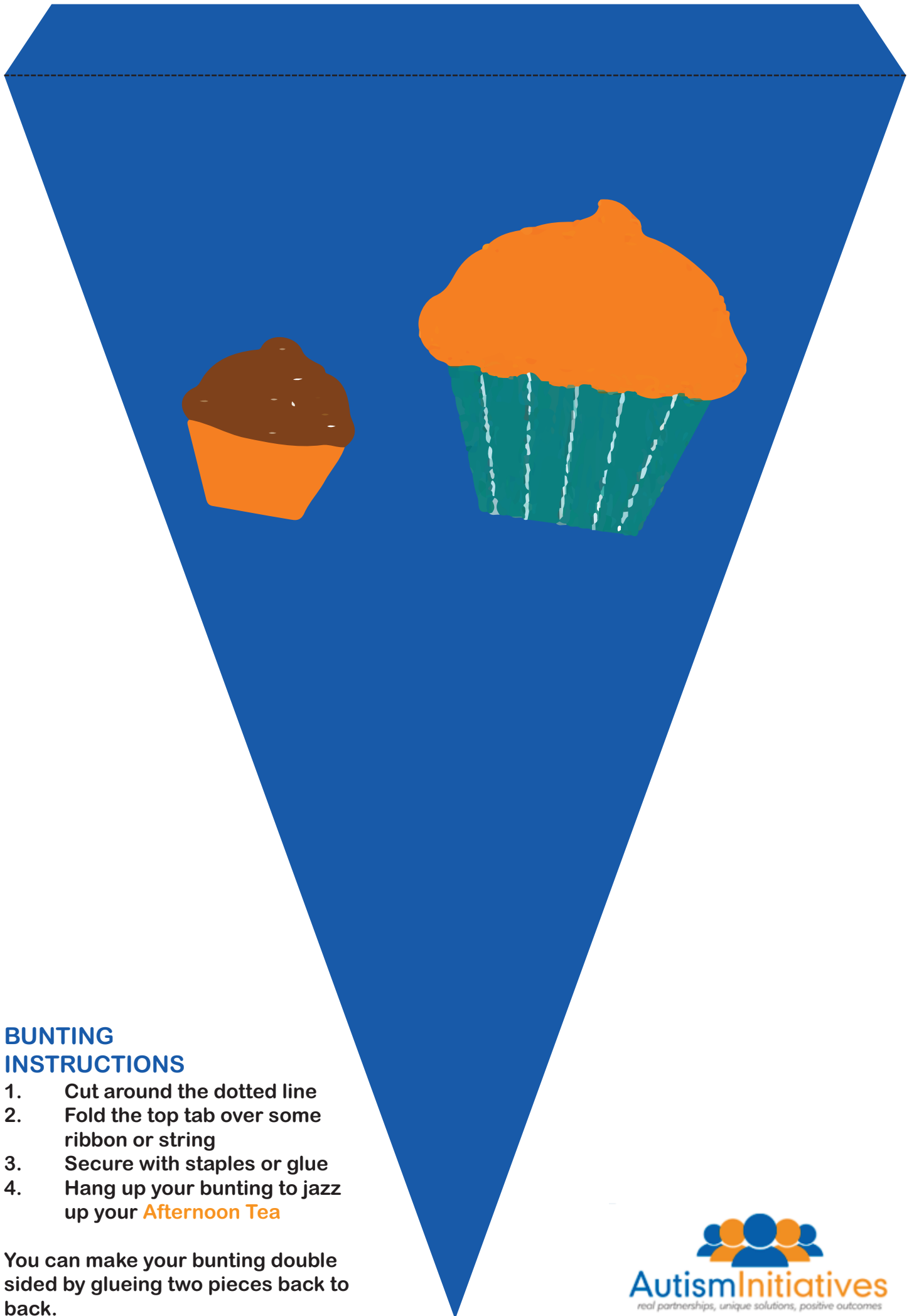

Instructions

1. Paste this sheet onto the back of the sheet with the Autism Initiatives logos on
2. Then carefully cut out the Money Slot first

3. Next do Folds 1 to 4, then 5 and 6
4. Then Cuts 1 to 8 up to the arrow marks
5. Beginning with Fold 1, and then 2 and 3, start to form the middle of the box, with Fold 4 forming the the box bottom

6. On the right-hand side fold the flaps in, starting with Flap 1, then Flaps 2, 3 and 4, ending with Flap 5
7. Repeat on the left-hand side to complete your Collection Box, sellotaping or gluing it into place
